closed end from the northern kerbline southwards to a point 1

metre north of the western boundary of No 6 b) 'Parking place for 2 hours no return within 3 hours Monday to Friday 8am to 6pm' in Brook Close east side from 21 to 41.5 metres south of Shaftesbury Avenue and from 51.5 to 61.5 metres south of Shaftesbury Avenue
