

Dear Kerr,

Further to our correspondence below, I would like to submit two additional documents, and provide some notes on my particular topics of interest for the inspector to clarify why I wish to be involved.

I have attached the transcripts of my presentations from the two committee hearings that were held for the application. I think these provide a comprehensive overview of my position on the issues at hand, and may also assist the inspector in seeing the process that we went through between the hearings to try and improve the application in relation to access/highways, and why ultimately this led in part to the refusal of the consent.

I would like to attend to speak specifically on the topic of the detailed design for the site access. I was involved extensively in trying to mediate and assist the applicant in improving the scheme after the initial hearing, and I have also been liaising with Hamble Parish Council and HCC Highways, including discussing this specific junction design as part of HCC's wider work on Hamble Lane. I have kept a record of all of the various permutations of the design, and am able to clarify all the various elements of the discussion, and why unfortunately the final submission simply isn't good enough.

Whilst I appreciate it shouldn't make any difference, it might be useful to the inspector to be aware that I am a resident of 15 years, that I live and work in the village, and am particularly knowledgeable about this junction because my home and office are either side of it, and I walk and/or cycle through it seven days a week. This is not a crusade by someone with an axe to grind, but a genuine concern to make sure that what we could end up with is at a minimum as good as the current arrangements, and ideally better. I am also an independent urban design consultant, and I would just like to make clear that I will most definitely not be wasting the inspectors time, just as I have sought not to waste the time of the applicant or the relevant authorities.

If you need anything else from me please do not hesitate to get in touch, otherwise I will await your advice regarding the process from here.
