


Investigating food chains

A food chain shows the flow of energy through living things



1. Find a habitat near where you live (woodland, grassland, stream)


2. Go on a hunt for evidence of food chains

(Nibbled leaves/ dead flies in webs / feathers / fur / bones / footprints)

3. Make up a food chain from what you find- write or draw pictures



4. What predators are in your habitat? Animals that eat other animals are called predators. What they eat is called prey.



Predator/prey game:

Play a game of hide and seek - one person can be the predator and the others are the prey. Hide well out of sight to avoid being eaten!



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
